
Hello and Happy New Year!

This past year Soarin' Hawk celebrated 20 years of providing state-of-the-art veterinary care for resident and migratory birds-of-prey that were injured or orphaned. When we started in 1996, a handful of volunteers provided care for about 20 raptors and did only a few educational presentations. In 2016 our team of volunteers provided treatment and care for more than 226 raptors and made more than 100 educational presentations.

We return releasable birds to their home territories as quickly as possible. Those birds who cannot be returned to the wild are placed in facilities from Utah to Virginia to live out their life being well cared for, or they may become educational birds for Soarin' Hawk's education programs. Baby birds are quickly re-nested to continue their care by their mother.

LEAD TESTING

After we were unable to save an adult Eagle, we purchased a Lead Care II Blood Lead Level Analyzer and are offering testing services to local rehabbers.

EDUCATION BIRD CONDOS

We realized that our resident education raptors needed new housing now. We have designed modular housing system that provides lots of sunlight and fresh air, is easy to clean, and easily disassembled when it's time to move to Soarin' Hawk's new forever home.

RAPTORMED

We joined the digital revolution and installed RaptorMed, a raptor specific veterinary and animal husbandry software that saves time and saves lives. Every care-taker can access/update the records from home, work and our outdoor computer station.





REGIONAL RAPTOR CENTER

Soarin' Hawk needs to move. In 1996 we provided care for 20 raptors each year. In 2016 we provided care for 226 raptors. The temporary facilities we built in 1996 are overcrowded and completely worn out. We have the designs for the latest in raptor care habitats, we have more than 200 volunteers, we have our first major donor and we are shopping for land. We need your support to reach our goal of \$350,000 by December 2018.




Are you funded by the government?


